The Myth of Masculinity in American Education

Dr. Frank Harris III is an associate professor of secondary education at San Diego State University. His research is broadly focused on student development in higher education and explores questions related to the social construction of gender and race on college campuses, college men and masculinities, and racial/ethnic disparities in college student outcomes. His scholarship has been published in the Journal of College Student Development, Journal of Men Studies, Journal of Student Affairs Research and Practice, Qualitative Research, and a range of other journals and edited books. He is co-editor (with Shaun R. Harper) of College Men and Masculinities: Theory, Research, and Implications for Practice (Jossey-Bass, 2010). Since 2004, he has delivered more than 50 professional conference presentations, research papers, workshops, symposia, and other scholarly addresses.

Harris received his bachelor's degree in Communication Studies from Loyola Marymount University, a master's degree in Speech Communication from California State University Northridge, and an Ed.D. in Higher Education from the University of Southern California Rossier School of Education. In 2007, Harris received dissertation of the year awards from the American Educational Research Association (Division J) and the Association for Student Judicial Affairs. In 2008, he received an Outstanding Research Award from the American College Personnel Association's (ACPA) Standing Committee for Men. In 2010, he was named an ACPA Emerging Scholar and received the ACPA Annuity Coepris Award for early career achievement. Harris was program chair for the ACPA/NASPA 2009 Conference on College Men and currently serves on the Journal of Student Affairs Research and Practice editorial board. Before joining the faculty at San Diego State, Harris spent nearly 10 years as a student affairs educator and college administrator working in the areas of student affairs administration, student crisis support and advocacy, new student orientation programs, multicultural student affairs, academic advising, and enrollment services. His most recent administrative appointments were at the University of Southern California as As-
