Procedures for Grant-Related/SpecificallyFunded Instructional Faculty Appointment

Preamble

GrantRelated/SpeciallyFunded Instructional Faculty (GRIF) appointments allow California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) to recognize outstanding externally supported achievements with enhanced salary from nontate resources during the period of the GRIF appointment. The purpose of the Procedures for GrantRelated/SpeciallyFunded Instructional Faculty Appointment is to establish the means by which instructional faculty engaged in substantial externally funded activity can be granted a GRIF classification.

Definition

The GrantRelated/SpeciallyFunded Instructional Faculty (GRIF) membervesras a California State University, Long Beach instructional faculty member. GRIF members will be appointed to a non-permanent academic year or antianth GRIF classification. The classification can be awarded to faculty involved in grantfunded faculty assignments as well as faculty assignments funded by gifts and bequests or by Foundation allocations. The GRIF classifications provide for additional salary at a range specified by the Faculty Collective Bargaining Agreement.

General Provisions

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The letter of appliation and the recommendation from the Department Chair are reviewed by the Dean. The Dean submits a letter of recommendation to the Provost that confirms the identified sources of funding and, if the Dean supports the appointment, he/she specifiesd meneoded GRIF salary differential. The Dean is responsible for obtaining written confirmation that the faculty member has sufficient external support to cover all costs. That confirmation should be obtained from the Office of Research and External Support when GRIF is funded by grants and coantch from the Foundation Office when GRIF is funded by gms a(d)15(he)qu5(h)11(e)]TJ 0 -7
